Hailsham and Uckfield






Martin Amis was born in Oxford in 1949, the son of the writer Kingsley Amis.

He was educated at schools in Britain, Spain and the USA, and graduated from Exeter College, Oxford, with First Class Honours in English. He wrote and published his first novel in 1973. He is a regular contributor to numerous newspapers, magazines and journals, including the *Sunday Times*, and the *New York Times*.
